When he was assassinated in St. Louis, he managed to arrange for a loan on the property by Willard Ames, owner of the Ames Bank. E.E. Moore, one of the founders of E.E. In 1884, after an apprenticeship, he established the first newspaper in Jefferson County, The St. Louis News. Thomas S. Buell, born in Pennsylvania, was an attorney for the Buell Coal Company in St. Louis. He died in 1906. The Missouri Militia was organized in 1847. The militia had five battalions in the state, St. Louis City having one. The St. Louis City Battalion had 21 members, including Henry J. Marcellus and Edwin J. Sims. It was a common practice for the city militia to guard the city boundaries while the state militia was engaged in the West. The fort was built in 1855 and was a present to the city from the state.
